Chenin Blanc Chardonnay Sémillon

Tasted at Seckford Agencies tasting Vivat Bacchus London March 2013

The nose is very rich and the palate has the fleshiness of ripe honeydew melon. There is a fresher feel on the mid palate with hints of citrus but it fills out towards the back with melon and ripe pineapple.

Red Wines

The Red Curator 2011 92 2013-20

Shiraz Mourvèdre Cinsault Viognier

Tasted at Seckford Agencies tasting Vivat Bacchus London March 2013

Red fruits are backed by black fruits lots of complex flavours on the nose and the start of the palate. There is richness and depth of fruit on the mid palate but then towards the back it is fresher bramble and redcurrant spicy and herbal.

Tasted in Bulawayo Zimbabwe August 2011

There is a spicy green herbal character on the nose and it gives a lean start to the palate. Although some richer black plum shows towards the back the mid palate tends to be rather hollow.

Tygerberg Chenin Blanc 2005 **88**

South Africa Tasting October 2005

The nose is quite light with a pleasant mix of tropical fruits and greengage. More weight of fruit shows on taste with sweetness filling out the mid palate and enriching the finish. It has good length with light fruity fragrances right at the back.

Tygerberg Sauvignon Blanc 2005 **89**

South Africa Tasting October 2005

Light, fragrant, green lime and gooseberry dominate the nose. The palate has a lively freshness with an exciting mix of fruit flavours. The finish is fragrant, elegant and lasts well.

Tygerberg Gewurztraminer 2005 **88**

South Africa Tasting October 2005

The nose has an ethereal fragrance, a mix of hedgerow flowers and exotic perfumes. There are light fruit flavours on the palate, sweetness of fruit, flowery and perfumed. The finish is fragrant and lingering.

Red Wines

Tygerberg Barbera 2005 **87**

South Africa Tasting October 2005

It is lovely and fragrant with ripe sweet bramble showing on the nose. The fruit is fleshy at the start of the palate but there is a mid palate freshness that enlivens the fruit. Attractive light flowery blackberry dominates the finish.

Ralph Parker Barbera 2009 **91** **2011-14**

Tasted at the Game Fair Blenheim July 2011

The fruit on the nose is rich and ripe with a mass of black cherry and damson plum. The sweetness of the fruit gives fleshy richness on the mid palate but towards the backer fresher flavours come through a touch of bilberry balancing the richness. The finish is spiced up by some toasty oak.

Tasted in Bulawayo Zimbabwe August 2011

Although the nose is quite rich the palate is hard and slightly mean. Bramble features towards the back the sweetness quite quickly overcome by red fruits and this leaves the finish hard and coarse.

Auction Crossing

Hex River Crossing Private Cellar

Hex River

De Villiers Graaff, A J Reyneke and Leon Dippenaar have redeveloped this wonderful old wine cellar built next door to the Dutch homestead in 1938. The two wines are Rhône varietal blends and they show all the characteristics of these northern Rhône grapes.

The name Auction Crossing comes from the original name of the farm “Vendutie Kraal” – auction kraal, so named as it was used for the auction of livestock by trek farmers heading north.

White Wines**Viognier 2007**

Tasted at the Hex River Winery February 2008

Very classic Viognier on the nose, the white peach is backed by aromatic flowers, lush but vibrant. Lots of richness on the palate, the peach fruit fleshed out by some mouth filling apricot, the freshness on the mid-palate balances the sweetness and the oak is very restrained. It is a big wine with just a hint of hot alcohol on the finish.

Tasted at the Mansion House July 2010

The nose has a lovely mix of flavours peachy apricot appears to dominate but behind is some fresher greengage. It has an attractive floral character with the ripe fruit, powerful apricot, filling out the mid palate and giving a sweet fleshy feel to the finish.

Tasted at Edward Parker Wines London July 2010

The nose has a lovely blend of apricot and fleshy white peach. This mix of flavours is there on the palate sweet at the start but fresher, just a hint of greengage, shows in the middle. The fruit

is perfumed the layers of flavours giving complexity. The fruit salad mix gives lots of interest enriching the back palate.

Viognier 2010**92 2012-15**

Tasted in the Jockey Club Rooms Newmarket December 2011

The nose has a lovely mix of fragrances with lots of white peach in evidence. There is more weight of fruit on the palate a touch of sweet apricot but the citrus that lies underneath refreshes, gives a lighter feel to the back palate and brings out the peach and perfumed fragrances on the finish

Red Wines**Syrah 2006****91 2008-14**

Tasted at the Hex River Winery February 2008

Made in the style of some Côte Rôtie, a percentage of Viognier grapes are macerated with the Syrah. Black cherry is very much in evidence, enlivened by pepper and spice. The rounded ripe tannins ensure that the mid palate is lush, packed with powerful fruit. The Viognier shows towards the back and this combined with a red fruit influence lightens and lengthens the finish.

Tasted at Vintners Hall June 2010

91 2008-15

The fruit is lovely and sweet with the palate fleshed out by the ripeness of the tannins. Black and red fruits vie for dominance, first black cherry and then red. The finish has all the pepper spice that one expects from the grape.

Syrah Viognier 2008**92 2011-16**

Tasted at Edward Parker Wines London July 2010

Lovely ripe fruit enriches the nose and gives a fleshy start to the palate. The black fruits, bramble and blueberry are backed by ripe strawberry, layers of flavour that add to the complexity. The palate has richness, sweet fruit yet enough freshness and structure to lift and lengthen the flavours.

Syrah Viognier 2009**91 2012-17**

Tasted in the Jockey Club Rooms Newmarket December 2011

The fruit on the nose is ripe giving sweetness and richness. Black fruits dominate the start of the palate but under the richness there is a mix of red fruits that adds freshness all spiced up by the black pepper that comes through on the finish.

Tasted in Lincoln's Inn November 2015

The nose has white flowers the palate is fresh at the start sweeter in the middle a mix of tropical fruits. Citrus under the tropical fruit mix refreshes and lightens but there is sweetness at the back and fruit on the finish.

Chenin Blanc 2016**90 2016-21***Tasted in Lilley December 2016**Tasted in the Mansion House July 2017*

Rich fruit on the nose the start of the palate peachy but under this there is pink grapefruit and tangerine freshness bright at the back with the sweeter fruit coming through on the finish. It has an attractive bitter sweet character.

Sauvignon Blanc 2016**88 2017-21***Tasted in the Mansion House July 2017*

The nose is bright the start of the palate has grapefruit and lime mid freshness. Sweeter towards the back more white peach in character the finish quite firm and crisp.

Red Wines**Backberg Dry Red NV****89 2015-19****Grapes – Cabernet Franc Cabernet Sauvignon Merlot Malbec Shiraz***Tasted at Lincoln's Inn March 2015*

The nose has a savoury black cherry character the palate starts with fresh fruit some bramble and bilberry sweeter in the middle supple and fleshy with fresh red fruits on the finish. An easy drinking glass of red enjoyable on its own and it goes well with chicken, prosciutto and pasta.

Red Wines**Morkel Malbec 2009****91 2011-15***Tasted at the South Africa tasting October 2011*

The black fruit mix on the nose has a herbal backing, hints of rosemary and this shows on the start of the palate. The mid palate has lots of sweet fruit blackcurrant and blackberry with the richness of black truffle filling out the back palate and finish.

Chenin Blanc 2016**90 2017-20***Tasted in Lilley May 2017*

Chenin Blanc is still the most widely planted grape in South Africa and Boatsman's Drift, (takes its name from the Flying Dutchman, a ghostly ship lost off the Cape of Good Hope and doomed to sail the seven seas forever), has the crisp apple freshness on the nose so typical of the grape. Fruity in the middle tropical fruits, guavas and mango breadth of flavour but there is balance with citrus brightening the finish.

Red Wines**Porcupine Ridge Syrah 2012****88 2013-17***Tasted in Lilley December 2013*

The red fruits on the nose are fresh peppery and spicy but the palate is sweeter with a nice depth of flavour more bramble and black cherry in character. The back palate has lovely rich fruit with the black pepper of the nose coming out on the finish.

Porcupine Ridge Syrah 2014**88 2015-19***Tasted in Lilley November 2015*

The nose has a peppery spiciness the palate a mix of red fruits fresh at the start sweeter and richer in the middle. Under the richer fruit there is freshness lighter at the back with lots of black pepper on the finish.

The Chocolate Block 2007**90 2010-15****Syrah 55% Grenache Noir 20% Cabernet Sauvignon 16% Cinsault 5% Viognier 4%***Tasted in Lilley May 2010*

It is all upfront with fleshy black fruits packing out the nose and giving richness on the palate. Black plum and cherry are backed by more herbal flavours with spice showing on the sweet fruited back palate.

White Wines**Boschen Blanc 2010****84 2011-13***Mhbizi Resort Zimbabwe August 2010*

The nose is over fat with a mass of fleshy fruit with ripe pineapple giving richness on the palate. Under all of this is acidity quite hard and slightly green that unbalances and leaves the finish rather hard.

 The nose has a lively mix of grapefruit and lime and the palate is vibrant and fragrant, nice depth of fruit with a citrus freshness on the long finish.
- Blanc de Mer 2005** **88**
South Africa Tasting October 2005
 The nose has lovely floral fragrances with elderflower underpinned by pineapple and grapefruit. There is a lovely freshness on the palate with a sweetness of fruit showing on the mid plate. It has an attractive lingering finish.

Tasted in Lilley December 2009
 The nose has the crispness of green limes, lovely and fresh with an attractive floral character. The palate although light and fresh at the start is sweeter in the middle, more of an apricot and tropical fruit mix. The lime and mineral freshness shows again towards the back leaving the finish lovely and crisp.

Riesling Viognier Sauvignon Blanc Chenin Blanc Chardonnay
Tasted at Vinopolis October 2010
 The nose has a nice mix of flavours tropical fruits with hints of peach and citrus. The sweetness of the fruit on the start and middle of the palate gives way to freshness that lifts the fruit and lengthens the flavours.

Riesling 49% Viognier 22% Savignon Blanc 10% Chenin Blanc 10% Chardonnay 5% Sémillon 4%
Tasted at the Wines of South Africa tasting October 2011
 The nose has an attractive mix of flavours with the sweetness of the white peach refreshed by a touch of lime. The palate starts fresh is sweeter in the middle and has a lot of different flavours showing on the finish.
- Blanc de Mer 2012** **89** **2013-15**
Riesling 49% Viognier 27% Sauvignon Blanc 14% Chardonnay 8% Chenin Blanc 2%

Tasted at Seckford Agencies tasting Vivat Bacchus London March 2013

The mix of fragrances on the nose has all the charm of a summer garden and the palate is citrusy and fresh with an underlying leafy quality. The tropical fruits on the back palate give a little more depth on the finish.

Blanc de Mer 2013**89 2014-17*****Riesling Viognier Sauvignon Blanc Chenin Blanc Chardonnay****Tasted at the LWF June 2014**Tasted at the Lea & Sandeman tasting Galleria London March 2015*

Light on the nose white flowered fragrant both nose and palate has a fresh citrus mix. There is more depth in the middle hints of white peach but the finish is crisp and citrus driven.

Blanc de Mer 2014**88 2015-17*****Riesling 69% Viognier 24% Chenin Blanc 3% Chardonnay 4%****Tasted at the Carlton Club May 2015*

The nose is quite full the mid palate sweet rather lacking in freshness. A touch of citrus at the back gives a slightly brighter feel on the finish

Walker Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2004**88***Tasted at Seckford Agencies October 2004*

The nose is flowery with orange blossom and tropical fruit and there is grassy gooseberry on the palate, the crisp fruit flavours tingle in the mouth. There is an attractive weight of fruit on the finish that lingers well.

Walker Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2005**90***South Africa Tasting October 2005*

The nose is gunflint crisp with a mix of gooseberry and tropical fruits. The freshness gives a racy character to the palate with a steely flintiness to the fruit. There is a lot of character shows and the finish is packed with gooseberry and lime.

Walker Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2009**90***Tasted in Lilley December 2009*

It is very racy very mineral driven with lots of fresh grapefruit behind the flint. Sweeter flavours come through on the mid palate, more of a tropical fruit character. The citrus is very much in evidence towards the back and gives a lovely freshness to the finish.

Walker Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2010**89 2010-13***Tasted at Vinopolis October 2010*

It seems to be more tropical fruit in character some lovely sweet flavours. The mid palate has freshness lots of gooseberry and these combined with the lime and lemon mix give a crisp feel to the back palate.

Walker Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2011**90 2012-16**

Tasted at the London Wine Trade Fair May 2012

The crisp gooseberry cut grass nose is backed by sweeter flavours hints of tropical fruits. The mid palate is quite rich with a white peach character but the gooseberry and apple freshness comes through on the back palate giving a crunchy crisp finish.

Walker Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2012 90 2013-17

Tasted at LWTF May 2013

The nose is citrus driven and the start of the palate racy and fresh fruited with lime and grapefruit. The mid palate has sweeter flavours more tropical fruit in character but it the citrus that refreshes the finish.

Walker Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2013 90 2014-19

Tasted at the LWF June 2014

Crunchy gooseberry the nose is fresh and the start of the palate crisp. There is a sweeter feel to the mid palate grapefruit hints of tropical fruits with the lime and gooseberry dominating and refreshing the finish.

Walker Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2014 89 2015-19

*Tasted at the SITT tasting London February 2015**Tasted at the Carlton Club May 2015*

Gooseberry and lime the nose is fresh the start of the palate crunchy. The mid palate has some sweeter fruit grapefruit and hints of tropical fruit but at the back gooseberry is to the fore the finish lighter and fresher.

Reserve Sauvignon Blanc 2009 91 2010-13

Sauvignon Blanc 88% Semillon 12%*Tasted at the LWTF May 2010*

Gooseberry crispness is there on the nose and gives a lovely freshness on the palate. There are richer flavours on the mid palate a mix of fruits with hints of tropical fruits backed by apple and grapefruit. Although there is sweetness towards the back the finish is very citrus crisp.

Reserve Sauvignon Blanc 2010 92 2012-16

Tasted at the London Wine Trade Fair May 2012

White peach and tropical fruits give a rich feel to the nose and a fleshy start to the palate. There is an underlying citrus mix that balances refreshes and brings out the oak spice on the finish.

Reserve Sauvignon Blanc 2012 92 2013-18

Tasted at LWTF May 2013

Ripe fruits give richness on the nose and more depth and richness on the start of the palate. The mid palate is crisper with an attractive mix of lime and grapefruit and this gives a racy feel to the long finish.

Sans Barrique Chardonnay 2003 88

Tasted at Seckford Agencies October 2004

The nose is very light and fragrant with a mix of melon and lemon. Sweet fruit shows on the palate, clean and crisp, the melon character is very much in evidence and lasts well.

Sans Barrique Chardonnay 2004**91***South Africa Tasting October 2005*

Minerals are mixed with fresh fruits on the nose giving it vibrancy and crispness. The palate has purity of fruit with richer melon refreshed by lemons and lime. The mix of freshness and sweetness is deliciously enticing.

Sans Barrique Chardonnay 2009**91****2010-14***Tasted at the Mansion House July 2010**Tasted at Vinopolis October 2010*

The nose has a mix of greengage and fresh apple. The racy feel of the nose is there on the start of the palate but in the middle there are sweeter flavours layers of fruit that give complexity. There is an exciting weight of flavour on the back palate the fruit richness balanced by the lime freshness.

Sans Barrique Chardonnay 2010**91****2012-16***Tasted at the London Wine Trade Fair May 2012*

Behind the fresh fruit on the nose is a sweeter richer mix of flavours. The palate has ripe fruit but enough underlying freshness to balance and give a lighter racier feel to the finish.

Sans Barrique Chardonnay 2011**91****2012-17***Tasted at the Leathersellers November 2012**Tasted at the Mansion House July 2013*

The nose has fresh apple and citrus an attractive crispness. Sweeter fruit greengage and melon gives richness in the middle but the finish like the nose has the freshness of lime and minerals.

Sans Barrique Chardonnay 2013**91****2014-19***Tasted at the LWF June 2014*

Lime and lemon refresh the nose the start of the palate light and fresh. There is richer fruit in the middle lots of greengage some honeydew melon and this mix gives richness on the back palate and finish.

Sans Barrique Chardonnay 2014**90****2015-19***Tasted at the Carlton Club May 2015*

Light and fresh the palate has a bright citrusy feel but there is more depth in the middle apple and a greengage. The finish is bright light and fresh.

Crocodile's Lair Chardonnay 2003**90***Tasted at Seckford Agencies October 2004*

Power of fruit on the nose, fresh melon mixed with just a hint of oak. The taste has depth of flavour, a mix of white peach and greengage and although feeling fresh has a suppleness of character.

Crocodile's Lair Chardonnay 2004 **92**

South Africa Tasting October 2005

The ocean's cooling breezes have given a lively freshness to the nose enlivening the complex mix of greengage, grapefruit and pineapple. The palate has depth of flavour, a sweetness of fruit but also a freshness that lifts and lengthens. The finish has a complex mix of fruits, white peach, melon and greengage.

Crocodile's Lair Chardonnay 2009 **91** **2011-14**

Tasted at the London Wine Trade Fair May 2011

The freshness of the fruit gives crispness on the nose green lime mixed with apple. Sweeter flavours give some weight on the mid palate but the overall feel is of freshness and purity of flavour.

Crocodile's Lair Chardonnay 2010 **92** **2012-16**

Tasted at the London Wine Trade Fair May 2012

Although the fruit on the nose seems very rich it is not over sweet or heavy. Greengage fills out the palate the fleshiness richness helped by the ripe melon that lies underneath. There is freshness that highlights the fragrances and gives a slightly lighter feel to the finish.

Crocodile's Lair "Kaaimansgat" Chardonnay 2011 **91** **2013-18**

Tasted at Seckford Agencies tasting Vivat Bacchus London March 2013

The nose has the fleshy richness of ripe melon and the palate has depth of flavour. Greengage dominates the back palate with the freshness of apple and lime giving crispness on the finish.

Crocodile's Lair "Kaaimansgat" Chardonnay 2012 **91** **2013-19**

Tasted at LWTF May 2013

Ripe greengage gives depth on the nose and a fleshy richness on the palate. The sweetness of the fruit is balanced by fresher fruits that come through towards the back a touch of grapefruit but it is the melon richness that fills out the back palate.

Crocodile's Lair Chardonnay 2013 **91** **2014-19**

Tasted at the LWF June 2014

Tasted at the SITT tasting London February 2015

Tasted at the Lea & Sandeman tasting Galleria London March 2015

The nose has a lovely richness the start of the palate fleshy with ripe melon and greengage. Apple and lime balance the richness and it is slightly lighter on the back palate yet the finish is ripe fruited with rich greengage.

Crocodile's Lair Chardonnay 2014 **91** **2015**

Tasted at the Carlton Club May 2015

The nose has depth of fruit the palate a ripe melon and greengage richness. Under the fuller flavours apple and citrus refresh the back palate bright yet there is sweetness more depth of flavour on the finish.

Crocodile's Lair Limited Release Chardonnay 2009**92 2011-15***Tasted at the London Wine Trade Fair May 2011*

Citrus fragrances are very much in evidence on the nose and the start of the palate is racy and fresh fruited. Sweet fleshier honeydew melon enriches the mid palate and gives more weight towards the back but the finish is apple fresh.

Limited Release Crocodile's Lair Chardonnay 2010**92 2012-18***Tasted at the London Wine Trade Fair May 2012*

There is a lot happening on the nose with depth of fruit backed by a hint of oak spice. The richness of greengage and melon is balanced by apple freshness layers of fruit helping complexity. The finish has power yet freshness and elegance.

Missionvale Chardonnay 2003**91***Tasted at Seckford Agencies October 2005*

The nose is full fat and opulent and there is lots of fruit showing on the palate, rich and ripe. The back palate is packed with greengage which integrates well with the spicy oak, generosity of flavour on the finish.

Missionvale Chardonnay 2004**93***South Africa Tasting October 2006*

Depth of fruit comes through on the nose, a fatness and opulence mixed with vanilla oak. The palate is rich, full of ripe melon with a complex depth and weight of fruit. Some oak shows at this stage but the power of melon and greengage soon envelop it and one is left with a mouthful of ripe, lush fruit.

Missionvale Chardonnay 2009**92 2011-15***Tasted at the London Wine Trade Fair May 2011*

The fruit is rich and ripe backed by sweet oak. The richness of flavour gives lots of power on the mid palate and fleshy depth towards the back. There is underlying greengage that refreshes the finish.

Missionvale Chardonnay 2010**92 2013-19***Tasted at Seckford Agencies tasting Vivat Bacchus London March 2013*

There is real fruit power on the nose lots of rich ripe flavours with fleshy melon and ripe greengage. Under the sweet fruit on the mid palate there are fresher fruits with a touch of spicy oak which lingers on the long finish.

Missionvale Chardonnay 2012**91 2014-20**

Tasted at the LWF June 2014

Tasted at the SITT tasting London February 2015

Tasted at the Carlton Club May 2015

Fleshy rich both nose and palate have depth and a lot of powerful fruit flavours. The rich mid palate is underpinned by apple slightly fresher towards the back but the finish is rather over heavy and sweet.

Hannibal 2002 92

Sangiovese Pinot Noir Nebbiolo Shiraz Mourvèdre Barbera

Tasted at Seckford Agencies October 2004

The nose is very complex with lots of different fruit flavours mixed with peppery spice. On taste cherry and mulberry are very much in evidence but bramble and strawberry flavours show towards the finish. It needs more time.

Hannibal 2003 92

South Africa Tasting October 2005

There is so much is happening on the nose, first black cherry, then mulberry and finally bramble. It has real depth and weight of sweet fruit. The palate is supple and rounded with the mix of fruits enticing and exciting, the sweetness well balanced by a mid palate freshness. It has great length with flavours that linger on the finish.

Hannibal 2007 92

Sangiovese 52% Pinot Noir 14% Shiraz 13% Mourvèdre 9% Nebbiolo 9% Barbera 3%

Tasted at Lilley December 2009

There is an attractive mix of fruit on the nose, some fleshy red fruits backed by bilberry and bramble. The cherry of Sangiovese is there on the palate backed by mulberry and spiced up a touch of black pepper. There is a weight of fruit that enriches the back palate with freshness of red fruits showing right at the back.

Tasted at Vinopolis October 2010

92 2011-18

It is very crisp with gooseberry and mineral on the nose. There is sweeter grapefruit lending some weight to the mid palate but the finish is quite hard and slightly metallic

The nose has a smoky character with the crispness of lime, gooseberry and fresh apple. There is sweetness on the palate, a fruit salad of tropical fruits, the sweetness nicely balanced by grapefruit freshness. The flavours last well on the back palate.

Leafy gooseberry and lime give an attractive freshness on the nose. The palate starts fresh with citrus intermingling with gooseberry and apple but there is richer fruit on the mid palate lots of tropical fruits and white peach giving it depth and breadth. The citric mix is there at the back lifting the flavours and refreshing the finish.

The nose is lovely and crisp with lots of gooseberry and green pepper. The freshness that shows on the nose is very much in evidence on the start of the palate but behind all of the freshness are sweeter flavours more tropical fruit in character. The back palate is classical racy and crisp with citric fragrances underpinned by the stronger red and green pepper.

 The nose is lovely and fragrant lemon flower in character and the palate starts very fresh with zesty lemon and lime.  Floral, fragrant slightly understated the nose has real charm nettles and gooseberry. The palate has layers of flavour with lime and lemon freshness crisp, racy but under the freshness the small percentage of Sémillon gives a touch of richness a hint of tangerine. Fresh at the back citrus driven flint and mineral the finish has an attractive understated ethereal quality.

 The nose is vibrant fresh with a citrus mix just a hint of white pepper the start of the palate crisp lime and crunchy apple. Bitter orange, tangerine and pink grapefruit give mid richness breadth of flavour a complex mix. The back palate is citrus dominated and the finish is lean and mineral, elegant, persistent.

 There is a lot of rich fruit coming through on the nose and the fleshiness of pineapple and peach enrich the palate. The back palate is very mineral driven lovely and long the freshness giving the finish elegance and charm.

Lemon flowers give fragrance and lime gives freshness on the nose and a racy crispness on the start of the palate. The mid palate has more generosity grapefruit, pineapple and tropical fruits yet the finish is citrusy fresh with an attractive mineral crispness.

The nose has white flowered fragrances bright and fresh fruited with a mix of lemons and limes. There is more depth on the palate ripe fruits honeydew melon and tropical fruits a mid generosity rounded from the time in oak these richer flavours underpinned by apple and mineral the finish fresh peppery and long.

Citrus and elderflower the nose is fragrant and fresh the start of the palate vibrant and lively. Sweeter in the middle greengage, nectarines and tropical fruits a lovely depth of flavour the richer fruit balanced by tangerine and grapefruit freshness at the back. The mix of sweet fruit and fresh fruit lingers on the long finish.

Ripe fruit on the nose depth of flavour the palate has sweet fruit rich on the mid palate. There is balance with underlying freshness a mix of grapefruit and tangerine. At the back citrus and mineral brighten but there is depth of fruit on the finish with breadth of flavour.

Constantia Glen Two 2016**95 2017-21*****Sauvignon Blanc 70% Semillon 30%****Tasted in Lilley September 2017*

Zesty fresh fruit peppery on the nose there is a floral charm white flowers and mimosa. The start of the palate is fresh limes and apple mineral but it fills out in the middle with yellow peach, nectarine and a touch of creamy apricot. Lime fresh at the back racy acidity the finish is long with purity of flavour.

The nose has a fragrant charm summer roses with wild strawberries, bramble and bilberry. The fruit is fresh quite light on the start of the palate with more depth in the middle an underlying

sweetness with richer, fleshier strawberry. Fresh fruit shows on the back palate a complex mix of red and lighter black fruits with flinty shale on the long finish.

The nose is fleshed out by some black plums backed with bilberry and bramble, although lovely and sweet it is not over fat as there is freshness coming from some red fruits, mulberry and strawberry. Lots of power on the finish, rich, ripe and succulent

Malbec 2007

Tasted at Constantia Glen January 2008

It appears very black fruit on the nose, first bilberry then bramble with some plum backed by leathery spice. The palate has real complexity, the fruit enriched by black truffles, the ripeness of the tannins is so well balanced by red fruit freshness that lifts the flavours and lengthens the finish.

There is all the floral forest leaf and green pepper that one gets out of this attractive grape. Lots of bilberry and bramble with mint and liquorice very much in evidence, the mid palate is firm, structured but as the tannins are fine grained tannins it has real elegance.

Tasted at Constantia Glen January 2008

Behind the bilberry and bramble is some cedar and spice all helping to give racy complexity to the nose. Mocha chocolate fills the mouth but this sweetness is well balanced by the firm tannic structure which, although very evident, is not aggressive and does not over dominate.

Tasted at Constantia Glen January 2008

The first impression is cassis and sloe but behind this is some red fruit that brightens both nose and palate. The mix of fruits has lots of complexity, hints of cedar wood pushing through, the tannins feel firm at the moment and tend to close down the mid and end palate but right at the back is lots of rich fruit.

(The red wines tasted in January 2008 were, at that stage, single varietals. The plan is to blend into a "Bordeaux style" blend using, hopefully, all the different grapes in whatever proportions work. The wines are still maturing in French oak)

Sleek black fruits show themselves on the nose, first some cassis and then bilberry all backed by some herbal cherry. The palate is full of black plum, lush and ripe but there is structure, freshness and spice that lifts the flavours and adds a more classic feel. The fruit lasts well with the feeling of more to show.

There is a lot happening on the nose with lots of black fruits dominating. Behind this black richness is some red cherry and bramble giving freshness all backed by black truffle spice. The palate is voluptuous, generous and supple enriched by dark chocolate and coffee. Tannins are in evidence and although feeling ripe do support the weight of fruit.

*Tasted at Vintners' Hall June 2010***91****2010-14**

Big fat chunky nose packed out with black plum and cassis. There is a lot of ripe fruit on the palate, black plum, blackberry and cassis enriched by dark chocolate. The tannins are in evidence but are ripe giving structure but not aggression.

Constantia Glen Three 2008**93****2012-18*****Merlot 57% Cabernet Sauvignon 28% Cabernet Franc 15%****Tasted in Lilley May 2011*

The mix of sweet black fruits on the nose is underpinned by bilberry and red cherry freshness. There is a lovely weight of fruit on the palate rich and ripe but behind there are lots of red fruits giving freshness and a leaner more directional feel. The balance between richness and freshness is excellent the fruit flavours long and the oak at the back giving just a hint of spice.

Constantia Glen Three 2009**95****2014-25*****Merlot 41% Cabernet Sauvignon 33% Cabernet Franc 26%****Tasted in Lilley June 2014*

Black fruited slightly herbal the nose is fresh but the palate has brooding depth with the sweetness of ripe fruit. The mix of fruits gives complexity blackcurrant and black cherry backed by fresher bramble. The tannins are fine the mid palate smooth, supple and polished with lots of rich fruit on the back palate and finish.

Constantia Glen Three 2010**95****2013-23*****Merlot 55% Cabernet Franc 25% Cabernet Sauvignon 20%****Tasted in Lilley September 2013**Tasted at the Loeb tasting Westbury Hotel March 2015*

Black cherry and damson rich fruits give depth on the nose and fleshy richness on the palate. The tannins are rounded the mid palate supple succulent lovely rich flavours with chocolate and liquorice behind the fruit. Under the fleshiness of the ripe plum there is red cherry freshness that gives a lighter vibrant feel to the finish.

The nose has a spicy mix of ripe black fruits the palate starts sweet and rich. Cassis and black plum are backed by firmer black cherry the mid palate peppery and spicy. Polished tannins add to the suppleness the seamless velvety fleshiness and although there is enough freshness to balance the finish is rich and sweet fruited.

Black fruit and black pepper there is a lot happening on the nose the palate has sweet fruit rich ripe black cherry, cassis and black plum. The tannins are fine and unobtrusive velvet smooth and supple the richness balanced by bramble freshness. The finish is seamless the sweet fruit backed by peppery spice.

Constantia Glen Three 2012**93 2016-24****Merlot 51% Cabernet Franc 24% Cabernet Sauvignon 25%***Tasted in Lilley May 2015*

Bright on the nose the palate starts with spicy freshness lots of bramble and bilberry. The mid palate has depth a mix of rich black fruits and dark chocolate with the rounded tannins adding to the fleshy suppleness the velvety smoothness. The finish is fresher with some spicy bramble and bilberry.

Constantia Glen Three 2013**94 2017-27****Merlot 59% Cabernet Franc 16% Cabernet Sauvignon 25%***Tasted in Lilley April 2016*

The nose has a spicy freshness the start of the palate a mix of red fruits and bramble. Rich and ripe in the middle the fleshy black fruits backed by dark chocolate velvety, supple the fruit supported by fine tannins. Brighter at the back a balancing freshness but the finish has depth black cherry richness.

Constantia Glen Three 2014**94 2017-27****Merlot 67% Cabernet Franc 20% Cabernet Sauvignon 13%***Tasted in Lilley November 2016*

The black fruits on the nose are sweet and ripe the palate fleshy and rich with fine integrated tannins. Velvet smooth in the middle supple but there is balance with spicy herbal bramble towards the back. Although the fruit on the finish is rich and ripe there is just a hint of freshness giving elegance and length.

Constantia Glen Five 2008**94 2012-20****Cabernet Franc 36% Cabernet Sauvignon 22% Petit Verdot 15% Malbec 14% Merlot 13%***Tasted in Lilley May 2011*

The nose has a powerful mix of fruits all very black fruit dominated. Although the tannins are firm they are supple and rounded so the fruit richness gives lots of flesh on the mid palate.

Blueberries and black cherries are enriched by dark chocolate and coffee beans but the richness is not over fleshy balanced by fresher red fruits and the tannic structure.

Rich ripe black fruits the nose has depth a powerful mix of flavours and the palate has a brooding black fruited richness. Ripe black plum enriches the mid palate ripe tannins and chocolate adding to the fleshy suppleness. There is enough structure firmer towards the back with herbal spice the finish though is deep rich ripe with black fruited power.

The mid palate is supple fleshy the tannins seamless and although firmer at the back there is the feel of more sweet fruit to show.

The nose has a mix of black fruits rich flavours and the palate has concentration a brooding black fruited power. The tannins give structure but feel ripe the black fruits the cherry, cassis and plum enriching the back palate. There is an underlying freshness an excellent balance and although rich at the back the finish has charm and elegance.

The nose has depth ripe black fruits the palate a brooding richness with black cherry, cassis and black plum. The mid palate is firm with structured tannins the black fruits herbal and spicy. There is balance with layers of freshness bramble and bilberry under the rich sweet black plum and cassis and although still quite tight on the finish there is the feel of fruit to show.

The nose has fragrance and freshness the start of the palate brambles and sloes. Rich and ripe in the middle lots of fleshy black plums, black truffles and black cherries supple and velvety. The tannins are fine and integrated and although there is herbal freshness at the back a hint of peppery spice and tobacco the finish has rich fruit depth of flavour.
